
Welcome





We believe the relationship between school, parents and pupil is critical in ensuring we achieve our shared goals, therefore all parents and their children are invited in for a meeting with a senior member of staff to get know each other. Parents will be able to ask any questions they have of the school as well as knowing exactly what to expect from us.

Before the school year is out for the summer break, we close the school for one day and invite all of our incoming Year 7's in for Induction Day. This will be filled with fun taster and ice breaking sessions. Our Induction Day is facilitated by student leaders; this allows our incoming pupils to develop healthy relationships with older pupils. New pupils leave our induction day with a real feel for a positive life ahead at Deptford Green!

Primary Outreach



We value our relationships and presence within our local community. We have an outstanding primary outreach provision that runs throughout the year. Sport competitions, music and drama workshops are just a few of the fun things we offer. This means your child should have already experienced our school in some form.

1st Day of School

To give our new pupils a little more time to adjust to life at secondary school, they will be the **ONLY** year group in the school for their first day in September.

After receiving their new timetables, their first day will be centred around getting to know each other further, their new school and the excellent teachers that work within it.



Summer Bridging Project

We know keeping young people occupied for the whole of the summer break can be a challenge. We also recognise this extended time away from school can heighten anxieties. We therefore provide a fun and engaging Summer Project which our incoming Year 7's can work on throughout their break. The activities in the project will help prepare pupils for life at our school in September. The main focus is on literacy & numeracy ensuring a strong start to the Year 7 curriculum.



Summer School



Again, in recognition of the challenges the summer break can present and after its huge popularity and success last year, we are excited to offer a summer camp to our incoming Year 7 pupils. Led by teachers, staff and student leaders, the camp will be focused on ensuring all pupils feel supported and prepared to start properly in September. This will be done using fun and engaging activities from all areas of the curriculum.

Enrichment

At Deptford Green we have an outstanding enrichment programme that runs throughout the school year. Pupils are encouraged to join a range of activities in which they can further develop their character and meet friends who share similar interests. This supports transition as pupils feel more settled as they form positive relationships with peers and staff. Our provision is completely free to pupils and simply requires pupils to turn up. Our most recent enrichment programme now rewards pupils who consistently attend a number of activities.



Meet the Tutor Event

Your child's tutor is a key staff member responsible for their daily pastoral support and as a result, is your first point of contact with any questions.

In recognition of this, in the first term there will be a 'Meet The Tutor' event in which you are invited to meet them in their classrooms. This provides parents and pupils the opportunity to strengthen key relationships as well as gain an early understanding of how pupils have settled in. This event is an extra provision and a formal parents evening will take place later in the academic year.

Transition Graduation



As your child will spend their first term settling into life at secondary school, they will also be developing their LORIC skills and GREAT values. More details on our LORIC learner behaviours and values can be found on the next page. Please familiarise yourself with them as they are at the heart of everything we do. We believe these soft skills and values will not only ensure every pupil is successful whilst at Deptford Green, but in life after they leave us. Your child's work in these areas will be used as part of their graduation from the transition phase into the main body of the school. Parents will be invited to attend this celebration with us.

Residential Trip

Although we love our community, we want to offer every year 7 pupil the opportunity to experience new environments. Towards the end of the transition phase of their education, we will invite all students on a residential trip. We want pupils to further develop relationships and test their character through outdoor and adventurous activities.

(This is subject to a strong uptake, it has been a very successful trip for the last 3 years since we introduced it)

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
