

## Free Music Tuition at Deptford Green School

Deptford Green School is committed to ensuring that high-quality music education remains accessible to all students, free of charge.

As part of our 50th Anniversary celebrations, we have launched the Sir Keith Ajegbo Fund. Through this fund, we are able to fully subsidise music tuition and continue offering instrumental and vocal lessons without introducing charges to families.

### Provision

- Students are entitled to learn **one instrument** and attend **one vocal session per week**.
- **Pupil Premium students** will be prioritised to ensure equality of access.
- Students studying **GCSE Music** will receive mandatory free music tuition.
- Students participating in **bands, ensembles, or school productions** will also be prioritised.
- All students receiving music tuition are expected to perform at a school event, such as an Open Mic session (where musicians perform to each other) or one of our public-facing events.

### Our Commitment

The Sir Keith Ajegbo Fund honours the legacy of Sir Keith Ajegbo, Deptford Green's second and longest-serving Headteacher. His leadership established the foundations upon which the school continues to build and grow.

The fund exists to:

- Remove social and academic barriers
- Create an environment in which every student can thrive

Through this initiative, Deptford Green reaffirms its belief that music education is not an optional extra, but an essential component of a broad and ambitious curriculum.
